Italian Language Study Programs Summer 2011

Living and studying in Rome provides both the setting and the incentive to gain a facility in the Italian language, a critical factor for successful theological studies. Additionally, comprehension of Italian is also essential for participation in a number of our apostolic programs and for a genuine appreciation of the society and culture in which the seminarian lives.

Seminarians who will be studying at the *Pontifical Gregorian University* are required to have at least 100 hours of Italian instruction before starting classes in October. During the first week of classes at the Gregorian, all non-Italian students will be required to demonstrate a B1 Level (European Union standard) working knowledge of Italian, which on average ordinarily requires 240 study-hours. Students who do not pass the Italian test administered by the Gregorian will be required to take an additional 60 hours of Italian classes before taking the Italian test again in February before starting second semester classes.

The College provides a four-week (76 hours) intensive program in the Italian language for new students during the month of September prior to the beginning of classes at the universities. ***Regardless of the university they will be attending, seminarians who know well enough in advance that they will be assigned to the North American College for priestly formation are very strongly encouraged to begin their formal study of Italian as soon as possible. We recommend an intensive language course of at least four weeks prior to the program offered by the College.***

Why not consider coming to Italy in July and doing an immersion course? Experience has shown that those seminarians who come to Italy early to participate in an Italian immersion course have a distinct advantage over their classmates who did not have an opportunity to do so. Of course, many seminarians may find it a bit daunting to leave home and adjust suddenly to a new culture totally on their own. In order that the New Men coming to the College might experience some fraternal support and find living arrangements conducive to fostering their vocation, we have negotiated arrangements with three Italian language programs in Italy that our seminarians and formation faculty have found to be quite good.

The Pontifical North American College will make reservations for new seminarians to study Italian at one of three Language Study Programs located in Italy. All costs for these programs (tuition, room, board, etc.) will be billed to the seminarian's sponsoring diocese.

Please review the following options. Of the three, we especially recommend the program in Assisi because of the past positive experience of students. A formation faculty member will accompany this group for most of the course.

3) SIENA – Institute Dante Alighieri

Description: **COURSE**
Intensive C10 132 hour course, 6 hours/day x 22 class days (4 in the morning group lessons/2 in the afternoon individual lessons);
Cost: €1930

Or

a C8 - 15 group hours per week + 8 hours of private tuition per week for a total of 92 hours of lesson at 1450 euro

Or

-20 group hours per week + 8 hours of private tuition per week for a total of 112 hours of lesson at 1550 euro

ACCOMODATIONS

Convento Frati Conventuali di S. Francesco: €30/day for single room (1 available) or €26/day/person for a small apartment with two single rooms and central bath (4 available) -meals not included

OTHER ACCOMODATION ARRANGEMENTS

The school is available to arrange accommodations with a family or in apartments. The administrative charge for this service applied by the school is €30. Normally the charge for a room with a family or an apartment is about €70.

MEALS:

The Sunday when students will arrive in Siena, the school is available to organize an orientation tour with the men in order to cover all their needs (meals, laundries etc.)

Meals can be arranged at a Self-Serve on Piazza del Campo (five minutes from the school). A 10% discount will be applied, i.e. a plate of meat and vegetables plus ½ mineral water €10 less 10% = €9. A full meal would range in the area of €15. An ID card will be required from the school. Each meal will need to be paid by the student.

ITALIAN LANGUAGE STUDIES IN THE UNITED STATES

Those seminarians wishing to remain in the U.S. until the end of August may make arrangements on their own at the **Scuola Italiana at Middlebury College, Middlebury, Vermont**. This is a seven-week total immersion experience. Students pledge to speak solely in Italian for the duration of the program. The *Scuola* may be able to provide special living accommodations in a separate house or dormitory for seminarians and priests participating in the program. ONLINE LANGUAGE COURSE

Before coming to Italy (or even while you are here!), seminarians may want to begin their studies of the Italian language with an online course. One such program can be found at www.capturator.com. Capturator has good, solid references and is one of the programs recommended by the Gregorian University in their university catalog.

There are 3 courses available online:

- **Course A1 'Basic'** for students with no knowledge or a very elementary knowledge of the Italian language.
- **Course A2 'Elementary/Pre-Intermediate'** for students who have already acquired a basic knowledge of the language.
- **Course B1 'Intermediate'** for students who have already acquired a good knowledge of the language.

Each course allows you to study for about 50 hours online at your own pace and from wherever you want as long as you have an Internet connection.

The cost for 1 course (1 level): € 60 (approx \$80); the cost for 2 courses (2 levels): € 100 (approx. \$130). Payment is made directly to Capturator.
